## **New location planned for village Post Office service**

Following the sad death of Graham Rees-Marshall, it will eventually be necessary to find alternative premises from which to operate the village Post Office service.

Initial discussions have taken place with the new owners of The Chichester Arms, who have said that they would be happy to allow the service to operate from the pub. As this is the only suitable non-domestic building in the village, their positive approach should mean the continuation of this service in the future.

Detailed arrangements now have to be made and Post Office Ltd will need to install the necessary equipment and dedicated power supply. Further progress will be reported in later newsletters.
