Traffic in Chillaton

The open meeting held in the pub last Thursday was attended by 34 residents and Borough Councillor Bob Baldwin. 28 people completed questionnaires indicating their preferences for action to reduce the impact of traffic on the village.

A detailed analysis of the questionnaires has not yet been done, but the great majority of preferences stated were in support of the proposals of the Traffic Group. Most of the suggested additions to those proposals were for an increase in the scale of action proposed by the Group.

Councillor Baldwin has subsequently said that he supports appropriate measures to reduce the amount of through traffic in the village.

Although the number of people attending was double that at the first meeting held at Marystow last October, there are many more residents who have not yet expressed their views on what, if anything, should be done about traffic in the village.

Because the presentation at the meeting was made up of slides and video clips, it will be possible to reproduce it as a video programme. This will then be made available either on-line, or on DVDs for those without internet access. There will then be a consultation period during which those who have not already done so will be invited to complete a questionnaire, after watching the presentation.

Due to pressure of work and other matters, the video programme will not be available for several weeks.
